



For more than 120 years, Chicago Commons' mission has been to partner with individuals, families and communities to overcome poverty, discrimination and isolation. Programs are designed to help children, families and seniors GO further to live richer and more fulfilling lives. Since Chicago Commons founded its first settlement house, the organization gives residents in underserved communities the tools and skills needed their greatest potential.

**Early Childhood Education:** Chicago Commons is a leading provider of high-quality, comprehensive early childhood education using the Reggio Emilia approach for children from birth to 12. Commons operates four year-round early education schools and has a dozen community partner schools.

**Senior Services:** Since the 1980s, Chicago Commons has grown to become one of Chicago's largest non-profit providers of senior care. Programs help seniors and disabled adults stay in their homes, preventing or delaying the need for institutional care. As a leader in senior care, Chicago Commons' Senior Services program consists of an Adult Day Service and Home Care program, to lengthen lives and ensure that seniors and adults with disabilities maintain their independence and quality of life.

**Family Hub:** The Family Hub program meets the unique needs of both the child and parent(s) by serving as a one-stop-shop for families to access services. The program provides access to a broad range of services that help parents gain employment, manage their finances, improve their physical and mental health, obtain government services, increase digital literacy and improve their English proficiency.
