



Rooted in a rich history of social services stemming from the Settlement Movement of 1890-1910, Onward Neighborhood House opens doors to improve lives and uplift communities through educational, economic and other support services in Chicago's Belmont Cragin neighborhood. Belmont Cragin is 65% Hispanic, 34% have less than high school education and 19% are below the poverty level.

Education: Education is the cornerstone of Onward Neighborhood House programming. We provide educational opportunities for all ages. Early childhood education is NAEYC accredited and received Gold Circle of Quality designation from ExceleRate Illinois.

Support: Onward House provides support to families in crisis through a Food Pantry as well as connections to resources and other partnership organizations for mental healthcare, immigration and domestic violence.

Workforce: Onward House provides job readiness classes and one-on-one assistance for job seekers, including GED and ESL classes, resume assistance, job search, interview preparation; as well as computer classes and resources for entrepreneurs.
